It calls us to remember that every person, no matter their past are made in the image and likeness of God and holds dignity and the potential for redemption.

Rooted in Christian compassion and justice this day challenges us to look beyond judgment and instead extend mercy, hope and support.

As followers of Christ, we are invited to see Him in the prisoner and to be instruments of healing, reconciliation and transformation in a broken world.




Prayer for Prisoners
