Basilica of San Giovanni in Laterano, Rome



The Liturgy today celebrates the Feast of the Dedication of the Lateran Basilica in Rome. There are very few feasts which replace the normal Sunday readings and Mass texts and many are a little surprised that this rather unusual feast is given such prominence in the Church's calendar. Saint John Lateran's is in fact the Pope's Cathedral, dedicated to the Most Holy Saviour and Saints John the Baptist and John the Evangelist and is called in tradition the Mother and Head of All Churches of the City and of the World. It may seem a local feast for the city of Rome, but it is not irrelevant for our celebration here in our own parish church.

The readings are not about physical buildings. They are about Jesus himself and also about how God wishes to build a spiritual temple in the world. He wants to build a community that worships him in spirit and truth. The Church is not a primarily a Church of bricks and mortar.

It is above all a Church of living stones, of men and women and of human lives. Our Faith is not a Faith of texts and books. It is a faith which must touch the innermost depths of our spirit. These living stones are Christians themselves – who come together around the one foundation of Jesus Christ, who is the "cornerstone".

The beauty of our parish Church is directed to giving praise to God and draws us into greater communion with Jesus. This happens above all in the celebration of our Sunday Eucharist when the community of the baptized are united around the altar to listen to the Word of God and nourish ourselves with the Body and Blood of Christ.



St. Laurence O'Toole



St. Laurence O'Toole was an Augustinian Archbishop of Dublin. Laurence became a monk and in 1161 he was named Archbishop of Dublin. He was involved in negotiating with the English following their invasion of Ireland and in 1172 convened a Synod at Cashel.

He also attended the General Lateran Council in Rome in 1179 and was named Papal Legate to Ireland.

While on a mission to King Henry II of England, Laurence died at Eu, Normandy, France. He was canonised in 1225.

A reading from the prophet Ezekiel Ezekiel 47:1-2.8-9.12

The angel brought me to the entrance of the Temple, where a stream came out from under the Temple threshold and flowed eastwards, since the Temple faced east. The water flowed from under the right side of the Temple, south of the altar. He took me out by the north gate and led me right round outside as far as the outer east gate where the water flowed out on the right-hand side The man went to the East holding his measuring line and measured off a thousand cubits; he then made me wade across the stream; the water reached my ankles. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; the water reached my waist. He measured off another thousand and made me wade across again; it was now a river which I could not cross.. The stream had swollen and was now deep water, a river impossible to cross. He then said 'Do you see, Son of Man?' He took me further, then brought me back to the bank of the river. When I got back there were many trees on each bank of the river. He said, This water flows east down to the Arabah and to the sea; and flowing into the sea it makes its waters wholesome. Wherever the river flows, all living creatures teeming in it will live. Fish will be very plentiful, for wherever the water goes it brings health, and life teems wherever the river flows. Along the river, on either bank, will grow every kind of fruit tree with leaves that never wither and fruit that never fails; they will bear new fruit every month, because this water comes from the sanctuary. And their fruit will be good to eat and the leaves medicinal.

Just before the Jewish Passover Jesus went up to Jerusalem, and in the Temple he found people selling cattle and sheep and pigeons, and the money-changers

Making a whip out of some cord, he drove them all out of the Temple, cattle and sheep as well, scattered the money-changers' coins, knocked their tables over and said to the pigeon-sellers, 'Take all this out of here and stop turning my Father's house into a market'. Then his disciples remembered the words of scripture: Zeal for your house will devour me. The Jews intervened and said, 'What sign can you show us to justify what you have done?' Jesus answered, 'Destroy this sanctuary, and in three days I will raise it up'. The Jews replied, 'It has taken forty-six years to build this sanctuary: are you going to raise it up in three days?' But he was speaking of the sanctuary that was his body, and when Jesus rose from the dead, his disciples remembered that he had said this, and they believed the scripture and the words he had said.
