

Foretaste of Easter's promise

No doubt by design this Sunday's Gospel draws our attention to Easter's upcoming promise of the tomb's no longer restricted presence. From the outset we are introduced to Martha, Mary and Lazarus as Jesus' friends ... a good place for us to begin this Sunday and allow ourselves into that relationship that is ours with Jesus, as friends, like Martha, Mary and Lazarus, for us as BAPTISED and SENT.

Martha's grief stricken plea with Jesus, "if you had been here my brother would not have died" is transformed by Jesus' interaction as he draws on her deep set belief and faith .. "Yes, Lord, I know that you are the Christ, the Son of the God". Jesus melted by the grief and pain of Martha asked to be brought to Lazarus' tomb, asked that the **'stone be rolled away'** and calling him by name, just as we are called by name at Baptism, we see something of the fruits of belief in Jesus' promise .. A share in what will be accomplished in his death and Resurrection . Martha's new relationship with her brother Lazarus is one that is no longer restricted by the tomb ... In **John O Donohue's reflection on grief** .. He reminds us ..

"The bright moment in grief is when the sore absence gradually changes into a well of presence. You become aware of the subtle companionship of the departed one. You know that when you are in trouble, you can turn to this presence beside you and draw on it for encouragement and blessing. The departed is now no longer restricted to any one place and can be with you any place you are. It is good to know the blessings of this presence."

He called Lazarus from the tomb ... and to those present he said **"unbind him and let him go free"** That we might walk these days ahead awaiting the unfolding of the Easter story with awakened ears to hear and eyes to see tinged by Martha's declared belief ... "I know you are the Christ, the Son of God" That he might, for you and me roll away the stone from entombed grief allowing our loved ones unrestricted presence to us always.



When 'Taps' finished, there was a long pause and then a bugler on the other side played 'Reveille', the signal of a new day beginning!

This was Churchill's way of communicating that, while we say 'Good Night' here, it is 'Good Morning' up there!

A reading from the holy Gospel according to John

Jn 11:1-45

There was a man named Lazarus who lived in the village of Bethany with two sisters, Mary and Martha, and he was ill. It was the same Mary, the sister of the sick man Lazarus, who anointed the Lord with ointment and wiped his feet with her hair. The sisters sent this message to Jesus, 'Lord, the man you love is ill.' On receiving the message Jesus said, 'This sickness will end not in death but in God's glory, and through it the Son of God will be glorified.'

Jesus loved Martha and her sister and Lazarus, yet when he heard that Lazarus was ill he stayed where he was for two more days before saying to the disciples, 'Let us go to Judaea.'

On arriving, Jesus found that Lazarus had been in the tomb for four days already. When Martha heard that Jesus had come she went to meet him. Mary remained sitting in the house. Martha said to Jesus, 'If you had been here, my brother would not have died, but I know that, even now, whatever you ask of God, he will grant you.' 'Your brother' said Jesus to her 'will rise again.' Martha said, 'I know he will rise again at the resurrection on the last day.' Jesus said:

'I am the resurrection and the life.
If anyone believes in me, even
though he dies he will live,
and whoever lives and believes in
me will never die.
Do you believe this?'

'Yes, Lord,' she said 'I believe that you are the Christ, the Son of God, the one who was to come into this world.'

Jesus said in great distress, with a sigh that came straight from the heart, 'Where have you put him?' They said, 'Lord, come and see.' Jesus wept; and the Jews said, 'See how much he loved him!' But there were some who remarked, 'He opened the eyes of the blind man, could he not have prevented this man's death?' Still sighing, Jesus reached the tomb: it was a cave with a stone to close the opening.

Jesus said, 'Take the stone away.' Martha said to him, 'Lord, by now he will smell; this is the fourth day.' Jesus replied, 'Have I not told you that if you believe you will see the glory of God?' So they took away the stone. Then Jesus lifted up his eyes and said:

'Father, I thank you for hearing my prayer.

I knew indeed that you always hear me.

But I speak
for the sake of all these who stand
round me,
so that they may believe it was you
who sent me.'

When he had said this, he cried in a loud voice, 'Lazarus, here! Come out!' The dead man came out, his feet and hands bound with bands of stuff and a cloth round his face. Jesus said to them, 'Unbind him, let him go free.' Many of the Jews who had come to visit Mary and had seen what he did believed in him.

The Gospel of the Lord

PROFESSION OF FAITH

I believe in one God, the Father almighty,
maker of heaven and earth, of all things visible
and invisible.

I believe in one Lord Jesus Christ,
the Only Begotten Son of God,
born of the Father before all ages.
God from God, Light from Light,
true God from true God, begotten, not made,
consubstantial with the Father;
through him all things were made.

For us men and for our salvation
he came down from heaven, and by the Holy
Spirit was incarnate of the Virgin Mary, and
became man. For our sake he was crucified
under Pontius Pilate, he suffered death and

into heaven and is seated at the right hand
of the Father. He will come again in glory to
judge the living and the dead and his kingdom
will have no end.

I believe in the Holy Spirit, the Lord, the giver
of life, who proceeds from the Father and the

adored and glorified, who has spoken through
the prophets.

I believe in one, holy, catholic and apostolic
Church. I confess one Baptism for the forgiveness
of sins and I look forward to the
resurrection of the dead and the life of the
world to come. **Amen.**
